October 28, 2005 marks the fortieth anniversary of the Second Vatican Council's Declaration on the Relationship of the Church to non-Christian Religions, *Nostra Aetate*, (*In our time*). In it, the Church declared that it "...deplores the hatred, persecutions, and displays of anti-Semitism directed against the Jews at any time and from any source" (#4). This groundbreaking document began a new chapter in the relationship between Christians and Jews.

695 towards Pikesville. Take Exit 21: (Stevenson Road to Park Heights Avenue). Turn left off the ramp onto Stevenson Road. Turn right at stop light onto Radio Tower Road. Turn right at next intersection onto Park Heights Avenue. Beth El Congregation is $\frac{1}{4}$ mile on your right.

From the south:

695 toward Towson. Take Exit 21: (Park Heights Avenue). Take a left directly off the ramp onto Park Heights Avenue (stoplight) Beth El Congregation is the first building on the right.
